GPP30 LEADERSHIP and PEER SUPPORT

COURSE OUTLINE

Course Description:

This course prepares students to act in leadership and peer support roles. Enrolled students will assist other junior students with their academic studies, during a classroom placement. Students will develop & apply skills in communication. interpersonal relations, teamwork, and teaching. Students will also examine group dynamics to learn the value of diversity within groups and communities. A strong element of this course deals with personal growth, through reflection on leadership activities.

Objectives for Leadership and Peer Support

- To help students assess and develop their leadership skills
- To help students improve their interpersonal & communication skills.
- To help students improve their ability to achieve their goals.
